

REQUEST FOR PROFESSIONAL SERVICES

Pursuant to Florida Statutes, the State of Florida's Consultants Competitive Negotiations Act, and The State Requirements for Educational Facilities, the School Board of Alachua County, Florida, (SBAC) will consider the procurement of architectural services for the following project within the school district:

PROJECT SBAC A0704 New Elementary School "F"

The project consists of the design of a new elementary school with approximately 800 student stations and core facilities including administration, media, food service, and support spaces. Site design will include playgrounds, parking, parent and bus drives, and stormwater retention.

Firms located in the State of Florida wishing to be considered for the above project should submit four (4) copies of the following:

- A) Letter of interest for project
- B) Standard Form 330 (GSA)
- C) Other firm information for review including the firm's current workload
- D) Proof of professional liability insurance (REQUIRED)
- E) A copy of applicable Florida professional registrations (including consultants)
- F) Prototype submission - The submittal shall include floor plans, elevations, building sections, and a representative site plan. A current cost estimate and a schedule of values showing the total cost of the building and site shall be included. The submittal format shall not exceed 11" x 17" in size.
