This agreement will allow several local school districts to share fingerprint results for contractors and vendors. This will alleviate fingerprinting costs and processing in more than one district, while facilitating compliance with the Jessica Lunsford Act.
8. Bus Use Agreements..... Githens
 - a. This agreement with the University of Florida is for the benefit of the Dean of Students Office and provides transportation on January 13 and 15, 2006.
 - b. This agreement with the University of Florida is for the benefit of the Public Utility Research Center and provides transportation on January 11, 18, and 20, 2006.
9. Child Care Training Agreement..... Edwards
This agreement with Santa Fe Community College will provide Child Care Training Courses at Newberry High School in the Academy of Early Childhood Education.
10. Tech Prep Articulation Agreement Edwards
The articulation agreements between Johnson & Wales University and Eastside High School, will provide eligible students in the Culinary Arts program to receive advanced credit standing on the basis of program completion.
11. Memorandum of Understanding with Alachua Bradford Regional Workforce Board..... Edwards
This Memorandum of Understanding is between the School Board and the Alachua Bradford Workforce Board, which is specifically designed for services for GED classes to Welfare Transition and Workforce Investment Act customers provided at the Alachua Bradford Career Center.

12. Professional Services Gable

- a. Professional Services Ranking for Project SBAC H0508—J. J. Finley Elementary School Air Conditioning Replacement, Buildings 1, 3 and 4

Interviews were conducted on December 7, 2005, for the design professional on this project. It is requested that the Board accept the following rankings: (1) Brian Cumming and Associates, Inc., Maitland, Florida; (2) Moses & Associates, Inc., Gainesville, Florida; and (3) Campbell Engineering of North Florida, Inc., Gainesville, Florida.

On September 6, 2005, the Board approved A/R/C Associates, Inc., Orlando, Florida, as the district's annual roofing consultant. It is requested that the Board approve a professional services lump sum fee not-to-exceed \$101,600 on this project.

- c. Professional Services Fees for Project SBAC R0505—Gainesville High School Roof Replacement, Buildings 2 – 12, 17, 19 partial, 21 partial, 22, and 23

On September 6, 2005, the Board approved A/R/C Associates, Inc., Orlando, Florida, as the district's annual roofing consultant. It is requested that the Board approve a professional services lump sum fee not-to-exceed \$92,595 on this project.

- d. Professional Services Fees for Project SBAC R0506—Gainesville High School Gymnasium Air Conditioning and Roof Replacement

On September 6, 2005, the Board approved A/R/C Associates, Inc., Orlando, Florida, as the district's annual roofing consultant. It is requested that the Board approve a professional services lump sum fee not-to-exceed \$47,750 on this project.

13. Design Development/Construction Documents for Project SBAC A0330—Horizon Center New Classroom Building and Support Facility..... Gable

PPI Construction Management, Inc., Gainesville, Florida, and Brame Architects, Gainesville, Florida, have prepared Design Development/Construction Documents for the construction of this project. It is requested that the Board approve these plans as presented.

14. Certificate of Final Inspection Gable

- a. Certificate of Final Inspection for Project SBAC A0432—Newberry Elementary School New Classroom, Building 3

This project has been inspected by the project architect and the facilities department staff. It is requested that the Board authorize final payment to the contractor upon total acceptance of this project. Final contract amount is \$806,366.08.

- b. Certificate of Final Inspection for Project SBAC C0495—J. J. Finley Elementary School Auditorium Maintenance/Repair

This project has been inspected by the project architect and the facilities department staff. It is requested that the Board authorize final payment to the contractor upon total acceptance of this project. Final contract amount is \$91,354.10.

- 15. Agreement with the Alachua County Commission on behalf of Healthy Kids Omer

An agreement has been prepared for Alachua County Commission on behalf of Healthy Kids insurance premiums. This program provides an affordable comprehensive health insurance package for school-age children who are not covered by private insurance of Medicaid.

- 16. Agreement with Florida Healthy Kids Corporation Omer

An agreement has been prepared with the Florida Healthy Kids Corporation to provide health insurance coverage to eligible students and their families. Matching funds will be provided by Alachua County, United Way, and private contributions; no district funds will be used.

- 17. Arts in Education Omer

A proposal has been prepared for submission to the Florida Department of State, Division of Cultural Affairs, for an Arts in Education grant to enable Alachua County students to visit the Harn Museum of Art and develop a greater understanding of Art. A total of \$10,000 is being requested.

- 18. Consultant Services Agreement Omer

An agreement for services has been developed to retain Donald Bernard as a trainer and math coach. Total contract amount is \$16,000 and grant funds are provided for this purpose.

- 19. Florida Learn & Serve – Homeland Security Omer

Last year the state of Florida received a federal grant to implement service learning projects associated with homeland security. Alachua County was one of the seven districts invited to participate, and we received funding for a peer mediation/violence prevention program. A continuation program has been prepared for second-year funding of this program. Grant amount will be \$49,433.

- 20. Math Coach Omer

A proposal has been prepared for submission to the Florida Department of Education for a Mathematics Coach grant. This grant is specifically targeted to any district schools identified as an “F” school during 2004-05. The Caring & Sharing Learning School, Inc., is the only school eligible for these funds. A total of \$75,000 is requested to provide a mathematics coach who will use scientifically-based mathematics instruction and materials to improve student performance on the Florida Comprehensive Assessment Test (FCAT).

APPROVED CONSTRUCTION CONTRACT CHANGE ORDERS
