On February 7, 2006, the Board approved Brian Cumming & Associates, Inc. (BCA), Maitland, Florida, as the design professional for the above referenced project. It is requested that the Board approve a professional services lump sum fee not-to-exceed \$95,955 on this project.

- 7. Design Development/Construction Documents for Project SBAC S0505--Emergency Shelters Retrofit..... Gable

FCI Structural Engineers, Inc., Winter Park, Florida, has prepared Design Development/Construction Documents for the construction of this project. It is requested that the School Board approve these plans as presented.

- 8. Math and Science Partnership Grant Omer

A proposal has been prepared for submission to the Florida Department of Education for continuation of funding for the district's Math and Science Partnerships grant. These Title II, Part B funds support collaboration with higher education partners to plan and deliver preservice and inservice training in math and science. Requested funds are \$1,419,961. Continuing major program components after the grant ends would require approximately \$200,000 in regular Title II expenditures annually.

- 9. AmeriCorps Alachua County Reads! Omer

A proposal has been prepared for submission to the Corporation for National & Community Service for an AmeriCorps state grant. This grant will enable AmeriCorps members to provide one-on-one tutoring to targeted, at-risk children in grades K-3 with the goal of improving their reading skills. A total of \$213,947 is requested.

- 10. Contractual Agreement with National Mentor Healthcare, Inc. Crowell

A contract has been prepared with National Mentor Healthcare, Inc., to provide individual and group mental health/social emotional development consultant services to preschool-age children who are enrolled in the Head Start/Early Head Start/School Readiness programs and have been identified, screened and referred for professional services.

- 11. Child Care Resources Contract..... Lagotic

Child Care Resources, Inc., provides subsidized child care for eligible families. Reimbursements are made monthly to the Extended Day Enrichment Program. The contract sets the parameters for both parties as well as the reimbursement rate. Over 200 children are served each year through this program.

As provided for in Chapter 194, Florida Statutes, the Value Adjustment Board is comprised of three County Commissioners and two School Board Members. It is requested that two School Board members and one alternate be elected to serve on the 2006 Alachua County Value Adjustment Board.

At the December 6, 2005, Board meeting, Wes Eubank and Tina Pinkoson agreed to serve on the Alachua County Value Adjustment Board with Ginger Childs as alternate.

2. SBAC Project Numbers B0432, C0432, D0432, E0432, and A0433--Change Orders Number Two for 2004 New Classroom Additions Gable

These five change orders add a total of \$32,800 to the construction contracts for reimbursement costs related to background checks required by the Jessica Lunsford Act. These change orders add no calendar days.

Teachers in grades 6-8 will teach 262 minutes four days per week and 205 minutes one day per week. The waiver request has been signed and approved by ACEA representatives.
