- 1. Employment of Personnel—Attachments A & B..... Longstreth
- 2. Change Order(s) Approved under Policy 8.53(1)—Attachment C..... Gable
- 3. Bid(s) and Requisition(s)—Attachment D..... Hackett
- 4. Purchased Products/Services between \$12,500 and \$24,999—Attachment E..... Hackett
- 5. Amendment to the Interinstitutional Articulation Agreement with Santa Fe Community College Edwards

This amendment provides for eligible students to enroll as part-time dual enrollment students in Santa Fe Community College’s Technology and Applied Sciences Program, with course work creditable toward an Associate of Science Degree, a Postsecondary Adult Certificate, or one of Santa Fe Community College’s Apprenticeship programs.

- 6. Subaward Agreement with the University of Florida for the Florida Partnership for Industrial Biotechnology Career Development and Training Edwards

This three-year Subaward Agreement will provide a biotechnology curriculum for high school students, emphasizing manufacturing. The agreement is for the period of 2/15/06-1/31/07 in the amount of \$15,083 per year.

- 7. Clinical Education Agreement with Shands Teaching Hospital and Clinics, Inc..... Edwards

This is a mutual agreement between the School Board and Shands Teaching Hospital and Clinics to provide students enrolled in the Academy of Health Professions with supervised learning experiences in the care of patients.

- 8. Tech Prep Articulation Agreements Edwards

The Tech Prep Articulation agreements are for the following program areas: Academy of Finance, Academy of Entrepreneurship, Academy of Early Childhood Education, Marketing, and Business Technology programs.

- 9. Title I, Part A Local Educational Agency (LEA) Plan – July 1, 2006, through June 30, 2011 Hall

This LEA plan reflects the shared responsibility of schools, teachers, and the district in making decisions regarding schoolwide and targeted assistance programs. The plan demonstrates that the district’s activities are in accordance with the parental involvement and the qualifications for teachers and para-professional requirements.

- 10. Title I, Part D, Subpart 2 Local Agency Programs for Neglected and Delinquent Youth 2006-2007 Project Application Hall

Educational services are provided through a cooperative agreement between the School Board and the Department of Juvenile Justice, District III, to provide programs for eligible students at the Alachua Residential Facility (Halfway House for Girls) and Alachua Regional Juvenile Detention Center.

- 11. Title I, Improving the Academic Achievement of the Disadvantaged – Part A 2006-2007 Project Application Hall

This Title I project includes 23 elementary schools, 11 charter schools, one private school, Horizon Center, and A. Quinn Jones Center. Individual school plans are integrated into school improvement plans and include research-based models incorporating computer-assisted instruction, direct instruction, study skills, strategies, and extended learning opportunities. The Title 1 Targeted Assistance and Schoolwide Project application for fiscal year 2006-07 is \$5,978,512.

- 12. Contract for Educational Services with Gainesville Wilderness Institute Hall

This contract provides for educational services to meet the needs of students enrolled or remanded to the Gainesville Wilderness Institute.

13. Contract for Educational Services with the PACE Center for Girls, Inc. Hall
- This contract provides for educational alternative programs for eligible students who are enrolled or remanded to PACE Center for Girls.
14. Interagency Agreement for Operation of the Alachua County Truancy Center with Corner Drug Store, Inc., Alachua County Sheriff's Office, and the Gainesville Police Department Hall
- This interagency agreement provides for prevention and intervention services for truant students in Alachua County.
15. Agreement with Early Learning Coalition of Alachua County, Inc., January 1, 2006, through June 30, 2006..... Hall
- This agreement provides child care services to infants of students enrolled in the Teen Parent Program for the period of January 1, 2006, to June 30, 2006.
16. Agreement with Early Learning Coalition of Alachua County, Inc., through June 30, 2007 Hall
- This agreement provides child care services to infants of students enrolled in the Teen Parent Program for the period of 180-day (10-month) school year, which ends June 30, 2007.
17. Cooperative Agreement with Juvenile Justice, District III Hall
- This agreement provides educational, mental health, and social welfare services to eligible students served in a Juvenile Justice setting at the Alachua Regional Juvenile Detention Center.
18. Florida Learn and Serve Grants Omer
- Proposals have been prepared for continuation of service-learning grants for the Horizon Center, Loften and Newberry High schools, and a new grant for Wiles Elementary School. Total amount requested from the Florida Department of Education is \$32,075.
19. OPPAGA School Safety and Security Best Practices Report for 2005-2006 Branaman
- Section 1006.07(6), Florida Statutes, requires school districts use the OPPAGA Safety and Security Best Practices to conduct an annual self-assessment of the district's safety and security programs for Board approval prior to July 1, and following Board approval, submit the report to the Commissioner of Education within 30 days.
20. Public Utility Easement located at Santa Fe High School Gable
- This is a perpetual easement between the City of Alachua and the School Board of Alachua County for the purpose of maintaining a 30' wide public utilities easement on the north side of the Santa Fe High School property.

- 21. Institute for Small and Rural Districts Black

This contract provides for specific services that outline professional and technical support activities provided by the Institute for Small and Rural Districts (ISRD). The purpose of the institute is to assist the 33-member school districts by conducting work sessions to address key state and federal initiatives impacting students with disabilities and those who are gifted.

- 22. Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA), Part B Project; IDEA Part B, Preschool Project; and IDEA, Part B, Discretionary Support Services Funds Black

The Exceptional Student Education Federal Entitlement Projects and the IDEA Discretionary Support Services funds have been allocated for the purpose of supporting special education and related services to students with disabilities in Alachua County schools.

- 23. Early Intervention Services—Head Start Program Crowell

A proposal has been prepared for submission to the Federal Administration for Children and Families, Department of Health and Human Services for continued funding of the district’s Early Intervention Services Head Start Program.

- 24. Contract Renewal--Medicaid Administrative Claiming Services Ward

This contract renewal allows for the reimbursement of Medicaid claiming activities.

- 25. Migrant Title 1, Part C Project Norris

A proposal has been prepared for submission to the Florida Department of Education for the Title I, Part C Migrant Education Program. This program helps state and local education agencies remove barriers to school enrollment, attendance, and academic achievement for children of migrant workers so they have access to appropriate public education.

- 26. Agreement with Early Learning Coalition for Early Care and Education Services Crowell

This agreement with the Early Learning Coalition of Alachua County, Inc., supports the concept of a comprehensive full-day program for Headstart children, which provides money from the Early Coalition to the Headstart program. This agreement is for the period of July 1, 2006, through June 30, 2007.

APPROVED CONSTRUCTION CONTRACT CHANGE ORDERS

- (1) Change Order Number One for Project SBAC, H0508 – J.J. Finley Elementary School Air Conditioning Replacement, Buildings 1,3 and 4 (Phase 1)

On June 5, 2006, the Superintendent authorized execution of Change Order Number One to the construction contract.
