Moved the Superintendent's recommendation to approve the Revisions to the 2009-2010 Code of Student Conduct, as presented.

Mrs. Sharpe stated that after 12+ years of voting for revisions to the Code of Student Conduct, she can no longer support a Dress Code that continues not to work. She emphasized that her "No" vote is not hostile, and her extensive Board development training has taught her that a decision of the majority becomes her decision as well.

Mrs. Childs suggested language changes regarding cell phone use. The changes were discussed and revised. With reference to recording conversations, Board Attorney Susan Seigle informed the Board that Florida has an anti-wiretapping statute that makes it a third-degree felony to record someone else's voice without their consent.

Moved to amend the motion to include revisions as presented by Mrs. Childs and revised through Board discussion/consensus.
