Dear Wildcat Family,

There will be no school next Friday, March 29. It is a Teacher Workday.

Medication should NEVER be sent into school with a child. Parents must bring all medications to the front office and fill out a medical authorization form in order for medication to be administered in school. Prescription medicine must be stored in its original bottle. This includes allergy medication, albuterol inhalers (unless they fill out a self-carry form), eye drops for an eye infection if given during school hours, even cough drops. Students also shouldn't bring vitamins to school, even in the gummy form. This is a safety issue.

We want all parents and students to be safe while on campus. There should not be any parents or students walking through the parking lot during drop-off or pick-up times. Please use the sidewalks on both sides of the parking area.

Now that the weather is getting warmer, we should review the ACPS Code of Conduct which states "that shorts shall be worn no shorter than "mid-thigh". Mid-thigh is determined by extending the arms to the sides of the body and finding the tip of the longest finger." In relation to shoes, the Code of Conduct states, "you must wear shoes that are closed-toed and closed heel and/or athletic shoes" (no sandals, flip-flops, Crocs or jellies).
