Parent Class Placement Input Information 2019-20

Dear Parent,

If you would like to have input into the consideration of your child's kindergarten placement, you may write a letter to me between May 16 and June 6th. Please note that the assignment of students to classes is a very thoughtful process that involves input from several professionals within the school. Parent input is valued, and weighed along with many other factors when we make final placements for students. In addition to considering each child's individual needs, we are required to follow the state mandate regarding balancing classes to meet the class size requirement. The front office will be accepting letters from parents interested in having input on their child's placemen. Writing a letter is not a requirement. If you choose to write a letter, please follow the procedures listed below:

- 1. Describe your child's social/emotional and academic needs.
- 2. Describe past class settings in which your child has been successful.
- 3. Describe any additional concerns you have as a parent.
- 4. Please Do Not Request A Specific Teacher.

Teaching assignments change, teachers move, and school populations can change over the summer. For this reason, it is important to focus on your child's needs rather than the name of a specific teacher. You may, however, reference a previous teacher of your older child(ren) if you feel it would be helpful in describing the best match for your child.
