

Hello First Grade Families!

As we get into February, I greatly encourage you to help your child practice counting forward and backwards by 1s, 5s, and 10s. Students should be fluent through numbers 1-120. This will be a great help as your child learns to add and subtract two-digit numbers in the upcoming weeks. Students will begin by finding 10 more or 10 less than a number. They will then add and subtract tens using various strategies including number lines, quick sketches, and using addition to subtract.

Hello Third Grade Families!

3rd guarter of 3rd grade is underway! As we Raise the Bar this quarter, we are really looking to challenge ourselves and push towards our goals. At home, we ask that you ensure that your child is reading at least 20 minutes a night. Ask your children questions about what they read, such as, "Who was the main character? How were they feeling at the beginning/end of the text?" or "Recount what you read. What was the problem/solution?" If they are reading a nonfiction book, ask them to describe what the topic is, and have them provide supporting details about what they read using support from the text. Those 20 minutes will help boost your child's proficiency, and reinforce what we are doing in the classroom. Your child also needs to have their multiplication facts memorized. The students are needing to have that guick recall as we continue practice in our math with twostep word problems. Please check your child's agenda planner nightly and sign it. We use the agendas to communicate homework assignments and upcoming events. As we've mentioned before, there are a lot of resources that your children can use at home that will support their learning at school (for example: iStation, Achieve3000). We would also like you to help in reminding your child to give their best effort in order to Raise the Bar! Together, we can achieve our goals! Please contact your child's teacher if you have any questions or concerns.
