- 1. Free of pornography and material prohibited under s. 847.012.
- 2. Suited to student needs and their ability to comprehend the material presented.
- 3. Appropriate for the grade level and age group for which the materials are used or made available.

In addition, consultation of reputable, professionally recognized reviewing periodicals and school community stakeholders is included in every purchase.

## **Collection Maintenance**

Based on the current analysis, weeding will be prioritized in the following areas:

- 1. nonfiction (1,668 items)
- 2. fiction (1,082 items)
- 3. biographies (622 items)

Weeding priorities for this section will include:

- 1. Copies with a publication date prior to 2020
- 2. Copies that have not circulated since 2019
- 3. Copies that are in poor condition

### Plan for Growth

Based on the demographic information, student achievement scores and current collection analysis, selection priorities have been established.

#### **Year 1**: (2024-2025)

- Update the oldest sections: Prioritize acquisitions in 800s (Literature), 200s (Religion), and 300s (Social Sciences).
- Weeding Priority: Remove outdated and non-circulating materials, focusing on nonfiction (1,668 items), fiction (1,082 items), and biographies (622 items).

### **Year 2**: (2025 - 2026)

- Expand nonfiction areas with deficits: Increase materials in 500s (Science), 900s (History & Geography), and 700s (Arts & Recreation).
- Increase diverse representation: Acquire books that reflect Black, Asian, Hispanic, Native Hawaiian, and multicultural experiences.

### **Year 3:** (2026-2027)

- Support varying reading levels: Ensure materials align with the average reading level of 4th grade, while also offering books for struggling and advanced readers.
- Strengthen literacy engagement: Expand graphic novels, STEM-focused books, and high-interest fiction series.
