REMEMBER!

When approaching a stopped school bus that has displayed a stop signal, you must stop and wait for the bus to withdraw its signal before proceeding. If there is a divided highway with an unpaved space of at least 5 feet, a raised median, or a physical barrier, a motorist who is traveling in the opposite direction of the bus is not required to stop.



1. The district will utilize the Flex Days if we have to cancel school for a hurricane or other emergency. The Flex Days will be utilized in the following order: #1 February 20, 2023, #2 January 3, 2023.
2. If more than two days of school are missed, the district may have to add minutes to the school day after utilizing the scheduled flex days.

A Message from The Alachua County Sheriff's Office

Keeping our children safe online has become the new "normal" for parents. The best tool we have to prevent internet crimes against children is education. During this pandemic, there has been a dramatic increase in online activities for our nation's youth. It is important for parents to have open communication with their children about content sharing whenever they are online. Take the time to talk with your children about the dangers they face interacting on the internet daily.

"See something, say something" has become a rallying cry for suspicious activity in our world recently. It has never been more important than it is today. It's how we protect ourselves, our loved ones, and our communities. By reporting suspicious activity, you play a role in keeping your community and schools safe.

Take time each day to speak with your child so that they understand it is okay to report things that make them feel uncomfortable. Also, encourage them to go to their teacher, school resource deputy or adult if they see or hear about threats to their school.

Take time to learn your schools emergency procedures. Whether you are in a new school or the same one you were in

last year, taking a few minutes to familiarize yourself with these procedures will ensure you can act quickly in an emergency. Consider downloading the FortifyFL app on your phone in case you need it during an emergency. FortifyFL is a suspicious activity reporting tool that allows you to instantly relay information to appropriate law enforcement agencies and school officials.

As a parent, learn what resources your school has in place for safety. Talk to your children about these safety measures and reassure them the plans are in place for their protection. It's normal to be scared when something happens. By talking with children and explaining why security measures are in place, it will help calm their fears and allow them to know what to do during emergency.
