High school advising tips

- ❖ Course selection...it's about **rigor** (Honors, Advanced Placement) for the competitive universities.
- ❖ Course Sequence
- ❖ AP vs. Dual Enrollment? Equal consideration in college application process.
 - ❖ Both can result in college credits
 - ❖ AP - must pass exam with 3 or higher for college credit. Does not affect college GPA.
 - ❖ Dual Enrollment - final grades in college courses automatically result in college credit, and the grade becomes part of the permanent college transcript and GPA.
- ❖ Bright Futures scholarships

College advising tips

❖ Take the ACT or SAT

- Either is accepted by all colleges.
- Bright Futures and Florida universities will “Super Score” the ACT or SAT, meaning they will take the highest score earned in each section to recalculate the highest possible composite score.

- ☐ All juniors sit for the ACT at BHS (March)
- ☐ All sophomores sit for the PSAT at BHS (October)
- ☐ Start taking the ACT or SAT in January of Junior year
 - ☐ Saturday – approximately every other month

COURSES REQUIRED FOR BRIGHT FUTURES

Both the FAS and FMS awards require the following high school credits:

- ❖ 4 credits English
- ❖ 4 credits Math, at/above Algebra I level
- ❖ 3 credits Science
- ❖ 3 credits Social Science
- ❖ 2 credits in same Foreign Language

Bright Futures GPA is based on these credits (all courses above 'regular' add an extra .5 weight)

BRIGHT FUTURES – GOLD SEAL

❓ **Gold Seal Vocational Scholars (GSV)**

- ❓ The Florida Gold Seal Vocational Scholars (GSV) award may be funded if a student is enrolled in a **career education or certificate program**.
- ❓ Florida high school students who wish to qualify for the GSV award must meet the following initial eligibility requirements:
 - ❓ • Achieve the required weighted minimum 3.0 GPA in the non-elective high school courses;
 - ❓ • Take at least 3 full credits in a single Career and Technical Education program;
 - ❓ • Achieve the required minimum 3.5 unweighted GPA in the career education courses;
 - ❓ • Achieve the required minimum score on the ACT®, SAT® or Florida Postsecondary Education Readiness Test (PERT) exams (see table below); and
 - ❓ • Complete 30 volunteer service hours, 100 paid work hours, or the combination of 100 total hours.

DEGREES AND CERTIFICATES DEFINED

Associate in Arts (A.A.) degrees are transfer degrees that prepare students to transfer into a bachelor's degree. A.A. degrees include 60 semester hours of college credit (equivalent to a minimum of 36 general education credits).

Associate in Applied Science (A.A.S.) degrees are career and technical degrees that prepare students for entry into the workforce. A.A.S. degrees include a minimum of 60 general education college credits.

Associate in Science (A.S.) degrees are career and technical degrees that prepare students for entry into the workforce or transfer into a similar bachelor's degree. A.S. degrees include a minimum of 60 general education college credits.

Advanced Technical Certificate (A.T.C.) are advanced specialized career and technical certificates for students who have already received an A.S. or A.A.S. degree. These certificates can consist of nine to 45 college credits depending on the program.

Bachelor of Applied Science (B.A.S.) and Bachelor of Science (B.S.) degrees prepare students for the workforce. Bachelor's degrees require 120 college credits, including 36 general education credits and 84 college credits.

College Credit Certificates (C.C.C.) are career and technical certificates that are part of an A.S. or A.A.S. degree program. These certificates prepare students for the workforce and are less than 60 college credits in length.

Career and Technical Certificates (C.T.C.) are career and technical certificates that prepare students for entry into the workforce. These certificates require an established number of credit hours (ranging from 15 to 60) and are awarded upon program completion.
