SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATION TIPS

Here are some tips as you research scholarships.

- Beware of scams -- avoid any site that asks for payment
- Submit early
- Be sure to check all submission deadline dates
- Review requirements for scholarship
- Don't just reuse your essay
- Review and proofread your application before submission
- Request letters of recommendation

Making your application the best it can be by providing information about your life, your unique adversities, and your goals for the future. Below are suggestions for how to strengthen your essays by using the criteria chat institutions utilize in the selection process:

- **Exceptional academic ability and achievement:** Strong academic record, awards and honors, college entrance exams, and participation in advance placement and honors courses.
- **Unmet financial need:** Limited family income and assets in light of educational expenses. Substantial university costs remaining after all scholarships, grants and financial aid are received.
- **Persistence:** Determination or perseverance in the face of challenges. Ability to establish goals and remain focused despite obstacles.
- **Leadership:** Ability to organize and positively influence others in and out of school, family, church, sports, and arts.
- **Desire to help others:** Purposeful commitment to helping others. Participation in activities of community service aimed at making a difference.
