Plan for Growth

Based on the demographic information, student achievement scores and current collection analysis, selection priorities have been established.

Year 1: (2024-2025)

- I'd like to make sure our nonfiction books are current, relevant, accurate, and engaging. We need more books on dinosaurs, and would like to add some space books too. We see students are interested in pop culture, so we will continue adding nonfiction gaming books sporadically.
- We need higher leveled books that are appropriate for elementary students. We have students reading at 8th grade levels in the 2nd grade, and we may run out of material by the time these students enter 5th grade!

Year 2: (2025 - 2026)

- I like our novels to be complete, current, and accessible. I want the new releases
 of novels, I want to make sure lost copies of popular books are replaced, and I
 want to introduce a few new series if possible.
- Our sports novels and nonfiction books could be updated. My biographies on athletes aren't getting circulated, so I might make a special section for those. I have reluctant readers who will read books on teams and sports, so I want to have multiple books on sports, not just one for each NFL team, for example.

Year 3: (2026-2027)

- I've added a lot of Spanish books this year, so I'd like to add more books written in Mandarin and Korean. I also want to make sure African American culture is represented in my collection consistently.
