

School Protocol for Covid Related Concerns-Student

	Student Exhibits Covid-like Symptoms	Notification of Student Testing Positive	Student has had Exposure to Someone Testing Positive
Administrator	<p>Assign designee to cover the Clinic or Isolation Room.</p> <p>Verify that Isolation Room is disinfected after pick up, and that daily disinfection is done to campus, particularly in areas of recent impact.</p> <p>Close off areas requiring disinfecting until cleaning protocols have been followed.</p> <p>Assign a designee to document the date student is allowed to return and ensure attendance clerk verifies the student is not on campus for the allotted days.*</p>	<p>Immediately notify the COVID Response Team at Covid@gm.sbac.edu for a positive COVID-19 test result. The following information will need to be gathered:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Student Name and Grade Level ● Student Contact Information ● School Name ● School location/Areas where they have been within school ● Date Test was completed ● Determine amount of “Significant Contact” with others <p>Notify the teacher(s) of the student testing positive to determine any significant contact made.</p> <p>Close off areas requiring disinfecting until cleaning protocols have been followed.</p> <p>Contact the Facilities Department at 352-955-7400 to determine the additional cleaning/sanitizing procedures needed.</p> <p>Notify staff and families in the classes of the student testing positive without providing any identifying information. Reassure all that cleaning protocols are being followed. Reiterate the importance of wearing a mask, staying 6 feet apart and staying home when feeling sick or after being exposed to a person with Covid-19.</p>	<p>If student has had significant contact with someone testing positive (being within 6 feet of the individual for more than 15 minutes in school or home/community)</p> <p>OR</p> <p>if the student is in the same class(es) and the degree of contact cannot be accurately determined:</p> <p>Direct parent to pick up student immediately, if student is in school.</p> <p>Inform parent that student needs to self-isolate for 14 days and be symptom free before returning to school.</p> <p>Close off areas requiring disinfecting until cleaning protocols have been followed.</p> <p>Assure the areas are cleaned and disinfected.</p> <p>Assign a designee to document the date student is allowed to return and ensure attendance clerk verifies the student is not on campus for the allotted days.*</p> <p><small>*While the student is self-isolating they may be counted in attendance if they engage in the Digital Academy classes. If this isn't possible, or if they are</small></p>

Nurse/Designee	<p>Take temperature outside of clinic doors, assess symptoms.</p> <p>Nurses will use medical history and latest recommendations to make the determination about when to send a student home or back to class.</p> <p>If Covid-like symptoms are affirmed, notify administration of the need for isolation.</p> <p>Escort student to the Isolation Room, maintaining social distancing, sanitizing hands upon entry, documenting student on the Covid Log.</p> <p>Contact parent/guardian for immediate pickup.</p> <p>Remain in the Isolation Room with student until pickup.</p> <p>Communicate with parent/guardian and share the <i>Parent Letter Checklist and Return to School After Illness/Fever (Covid-19 Symptoms) Letter</i> upon check out.</p>	<p>Document the information on the Covid-19 Log.</p> <p>Inform the parent/guardian of the individual that those who have been in close contact (siblings, etc.) need to self-isolate for 14 days.</p> <p>Recommend that parent/guardian seek guidance from their medical provider and inform the doctor of the positive test results.</p> <p>Share with parent/guardian the <i>Parent Letter Checklist and Return to School After Illness/Fever (Covid-19 Symptoms) Letter</i>.</p>	<p>After Administrator contacts parent/guardian of significant contact:</p> <p>Escort student to the Isolation Room and follow protocol until parent pick up.</p> <p>Inform parent/guardian that student needs to self-isolate for 14 days and be symptom free before returning to school.</p> <p>Recommend that parent/guardian seek guidance from their medical provider.</p> <p>Share the <i>Parent Letter Checklist and Return to School Covid-19 Letter</i> with parent/guardian.</p>

<p>Student may Return to School:</p>	<p>When they have gone 24 hours with no fever without the use of fever-reducing medications, their symptoms have improved AND it has been at least 10 days since the symptoms first appeared</p> <p>OR</p> <p>They have tested negative, have been fever free for 24 hours, and have been cleared to return in writing by a medical provider.</p> <p><u>What to do when you feel sick</u></p>	<p>When they have gone 24 hours with no fever without the use of fever-reducing medications, symptoms have improved, it has been at least 10 days since the test was administered, AND</p> <p>They have been cleared to return in writing by a medical provider.</p> <p><u>Guidelines for Return</u></p>	<p>When it has been at least 14 days since exposure to someone testing positive AND they have had no fever or symptoms for 3 days.</p> <p>If fever or other symptoms develop, it is recommended that the parent seek guidance from a medical provider and get the student tested.</p> <p><u>When to Isolate</u></p>
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
