- Purchase CURRENT biographies of political, musical, athletic and other notable figures.
- Weed FICTION section of under circulated books.

Year 3: (2026-2027)

- Build back NF section from previous weeding using teacher and student surveys.
- Weed Class Sets that haven't been used in last 5 years.
