Dear Alachua County Public School families:

Alachua County Public Schools is in regular communication with the Alachua County Health Department regarding the coronavirus, also known as COVID-19. According to the Centers for Disease Control, there are NO cases of COVID-19 in Alachua County or in the State of Florida. A recent advisory from the CDC states that "for the general American public, who are unlikely to be exposed to this virus at this time, the immediate health risk from COVID-19 is considered low."

However, the district will continue to monitor the situation in collaboration with Health Department. In the meantime, we ask that families follow these practices:

- Keep students or other family members home if they are sick. Those with flu-like symptoms should remain home until at least 24 hours after symptoms have ended, including fever.
- Wash hands regularly. Everyone should wash their hands regularly with soap and water, especially after coughing or sneezing. Alcohol-based hand sanitizers may also be used.
- Cover coughs and sneezes, and if a tissue is not available, cough into your elbow, NOT your hand.
- Avoid sharing cups, utensils and other such items.
