

**ATTENTION PARENTS:** it's not too late to help your child become a better reader before the new school year begins. Summer is an important time for students to keep reading and improve their language skills. If your child hasn't been reading regularly this summer, they may be in danger of the "summer slide"—a decline in their reading ability.

Numerous studies indicate that students who don't read or read infrequently during their summer vacation see their reading abilities stagnate or decline. This effect becomes more pronounced as students get older and advance through the school system.

"It's like if you play an instrument but put it down for three months," said Laurie Calvert, a teacher who is working as the Director of Teacher Outreach at ED. She wrote an academic thesis on improving summer reading programs at her North Carolina high school. "You're not going to be as good as a person who continues to play the instrument over those three months."

This "summer slide" can be avoided by ensuring that children are as engaged as possible in whatever they choose to read—just as long as they're reading every day.

"Anything that keeps students reading works," Calvert said. "The more engaged you are in the text, the closer you're going to read it. The closer you read it, the more you comprehend. And that process grows your skill."

**Comprehension Test!** – using notebook paper or Google Docs/MS Word or an online quiz generator Create a multiple choice test that contains at least 20 questions about the series.

- 1. Each guestion must have 4 possible choices.

## Character Alphabet! – using notebook paper or Google Docs/MS Word

Choose a character you liked from the series and then create sentences using a main word that begins with the next letter in the alphabet – your goal is to show your deep knowledge of the character. You will end up with a sentence for each letter of the alphabet (X and Z will work as long as your main word in the sentence contains that letter)

For example, if your favorite character was the Giant from the tale of "Jack and the Beanstalk", your Character Alphabet might look like this:

A is for the ANGER the giant felt when he realized Jack had stolen his harp and hen.

B is for the BREAD that the giant wanted to make using Jack's bones.

C is for the CHOPPING of the vine that caused the giant to fall to his death.

... and so on until you get to Z! (And remember, most characters have something  $E\underline{X}TRA$  or  $CRA\underline{Z}Y$  going on at some point in their story....)

**Infographic!** – using posterboard-sized paper or an online app/site (just Google search the phrase "infographic creator", there are several very good free sites that can be used) or Google Slides/MS PowerPoint

- 1. Make sure the title of the series is strongly featured.
- 2. Use words, phrases, and sentences that illustrate or tell about important
  - (A) Settings, (B) Characters, and (C) Events in the series.
- 3. Use images (drawn or collected from the internet, magazines, etc.) to help illustrate what you are describing in #2.
- 4. Work to create at least 12 such words, phrases, or sentences for #2 so that the whole posterboard paper or computer graphic will be covered.
- 5. The viewer of your Infographic should be able to get a good feel for the main characters, places, and events in the series.

## Cartoon It! (aka "Storyboard It!") – using paper or MS PowerPoint/Google Slides

Think of the plot for the series and create at least one panel (8.5"x11" piece of paper, PPT slide, etc.) to illustrate *each* of those important moments. You should use both images (drawn or collected from the internet, magazines, etc.) as well as words (both descriptions as well as "speech bubbles").

Remember plot structure?

Exposition (Introduces the Setting [where and when] and Main Characters [protagonist, antagonist])


Conflict (What is the problem that the protagonist(s) are faced with having to overcome?)

Rising Action (What events lead up to the "big moment" in the story?) – this will require several pieces of paper or slides because in a series there are a <u>lot</u> of different events that lead up to that ultimate "big moment".

Climax (The "big moment" in the story, where the main problem is either solved or it isn't.)

Falling Action (What events happen as a direct result of the Climax?)

Resolution (How is the story ended, how have the main characters changed, what are they doing?)




The Lord of the Rings series by J.R.R. Tolkien

3 Books (Book 1: The Fellowship of the Ring)

One Ring to Rule Them All.
One Ring to Find Them.
One Ring to Bring Them All
And in the Darkness, Bind Them.

In ancient times the Rings of Power were crafted by the Elven-smiths; then Sauron, The Dark Lord, forged the One Ring, filling it with his own power so that he could rule all others. Addison Coleman's life is one big "What if?" As a Searcher, whenever Addie is faced with a choice, she can look into the future and see both outcomes. It's the ultimate insurance plan against disaster. Or so she thought. 3 Books (Book 1: Fever Crumb)


There's a secret lurking in Fever's past, a secret only she can uncover, a secret she <u>cannot</u> ignore.

3 Books (Book 1: Leviathan)


Choose a side: Beastie or Clanker?

Franny Chapman just wants some peace.



The Youngest Templar by Michael P. Spradlin


3 Books (Book 1: Keeper of the Grail)

The bomber was in a death dive...


Henry looked up through the shattered window and saw the green, leafy domes of treetops racing toward him. Closer, closer. There wasn't anything left to do but die.

5 Books (Book 1: The Selection)


35 girls. 1 crown.

Connor, Risa, and Lev are running for their lives.


The Second Civil War was fought over reproductive rights. The chilling resolution: Life is protected and nurtured from the moment of conception until age thirteen.

3 Books (Book 1: All Fall Down)


Grace Blakely is absolutely certain of three things:

Ashes by Ilsa J. Bick


3 Books (Book 1: Ashes)

Razorland by Anne Aguirre


3 Books (Book 1: Enclave)

The danger is real.



Trust no one.


Benson Fisher thought that a scholarship to Maxfield Academy would be the ticket out of his dead-end life.

What a killer coincidence!


Aphra Behn Connolly has the type of life most teenage girls envy.

2 Books (Book 1: The Compound)


They can't get out. He won't let them out.

4 Books (Book 1: Falling Hard)


It's hard to be the new girl – especially in a new country.


Warriors Rock!
