MATH CLUB BY HENRY TAKSIER

Saturday, November 10th, nine fifth graders and seven fourth graders represented our school at the James S. Rickards Fall Invitational, a prestigious math competition for elementary, middle, and high schools at Rickards High School in Tallahassee. With approximately 700 students from over 35 schools last year, the Rickards Invitational is one of the largest math competitions in Florida.

Both of our teams dominated the competition—our fourth grade team won first place among all fourth grade teams, and our fifth grade team won first place among all fifth grade teams. Of 73 individual competitors, four of our fifth graders placed in the top ten. Of 54 competitors, two of our fourth graders placed in the top ten.

The Rickards Fall Invitational was only the start of a season filled with exciting math competitions. On November 13th, over 50 fourth and fifth graders at Williams Elementary participated in the Math Olympiad. Of those students, eight received a perfect score. Between now and April, there will be four more Olympiads, and at the end of the season, a small collection of top-scoring competitors will advance to the district championships at Buchholz High School.

Every fourth and fifth grade student at Williams Elementary is welcome to participate in these competitions and to train for them (and have fun along the way) at our math club, which meets in the Media Center on Fridays. To learn more, email Mr. Taksier at taksierh@gm.sbac.edu.
