We have expanded the color options on the bottoms to "any solid color bottoms" with no embellishments, rips, holes, or frays. We are committed to stronger enforcement and higher expectation in the coming year.

Williams Elementary School Dress Code Policy 2019 – 2020

- PLAIN, SOLID COLOR Polo style shirts, long-sleeve or short, in ANY ONE COLOR.
- Shirts should be one color only, and free from any stripes or designs. <u>One</u> small, quartersized logo is acceptable.
- School spirit shirts (Williams Elementary T-shirts). Can be worn and may be purchased in the front office or through school groups or grade levels.
- <u>PLAIN,SOLID COLOR</u> shorts, pants, skirts, skorts, or dresses. All items should be free from holes, embellishments, cuts, and frays. Length should be mid-thigh and/or LONGER than when arm extended down the middle finger hits the thigh. NO LEGGINGS.
- Belts must be worn for any pants, shorts, skirts not fitted at the waist. Undergarments should not be seen at any time.

Students are expected to follow the above dress code **EVERYDAY**. This includes picture day.

There will be a few days throughout the year designated school-wide dress up days and parents will be notified of those days well in advance.

Violation of the school's dress code policy is a violation of the Alachua County Schools Code of Student Conduct. Repeat and/or continued violation of the policy may result in progressive discipline.
