Buchholz High School math team wins another state title

Both Gainesville High School and Eastside High also competed in the state competition. GHS took 9th overall, while an Eastside student won a first-place award.

The state competition was held in person in Orlando this past weekend, but students were also able to participate virtually. Those who competed virtually had to do so under the direct supervision.
