Welcome to Pre-IB Spanish 1. My name is Kevin Vernon and whether you have taken a Spanish course before or not, I look forward to meeting you and being your Spanish teacher. As your content area expert, it is my job to teach you the basics of reading, writing, listening, and speaking in Spanish. Below you will find your first vocabulary sheet. There are 10 sections if you include the alphabet and numbers through 30 listed at the bottom. I would like you to have this vocabulary sheet printed out, filled in, and practiced by day 1 of class. There will be some allowances for pronunciation for new students to the language, and we will go over all of these terms in class, but not before I **check this assignment and award points for completing it.** There are countless resources online and some good (if somewhat childish, if I am being honest) videos on Youtube which cover the alphabet and numbers and include pronunciation.

A clarification I am often asked for pertaining to the vocab sheet: The "Repeat" columns are optional, but can be used to practice the vocabulary. In order to learn new material, studies show that on average you have to "learn it" 3 different times. So, if you periodically revisit the vocabulary, quiz yourself by covering over parts of it and/or rewrite it, you are more likely to remember the vocabulary. Flashcards are also great for this. If you know your stuff, you can simply fill in the "definition" column, though.
