GRAD YEAR 2026

24 credit

- English: 4 credits required
- Math: 4 credits required including Algebra 1 & Geometry
- Social Studies: 3 credits including World History, US History, Government, Economics
- Science: 3 credits required including Biology
- Art: 1 credit in art
- PE: 1 credit in physical education with the integration of health
- Electives: 8 electives
- Assessments: Must pass Algebra 1 EOC & 10th grade FAST ELA
- GPA: 2.0 cumulative un-weighted



18 credit

- GPA: 2.0 cumulative un-weighted



18 credit

- English: 4 credits required

REQUIRED eLECTIVES



- 1 credit of art required to graduate
 - All art classes are noted in the Art Section of your form. CTE classes *can* also count as art credits.
- PE Requirement
 - Review options and courses on registration sheet
 - Choose your option and then choose courses if you need it
 - Sports Waivers** - DOES NOT GIVE CREDIT! If you replace PE with a sports waiver you will need to pick up an extra elective somewhere else.



ACADEMIC eLECTIVES



- Colleges like to see challenging curriculum- do more than the minimum to stand out and to be prepared
 - Psychology, AP Capstone, AP Art History
 - World Languages like Spanish
 - Additional Math, Science, or Social Studies courses (more than required)
- 2 Years of the Same World Language is required for:
 - University Admissions
 - Bright Futures Scholarships
 - Scholar Diploma Designations (This is described more on our website)

- Learn about AP Expectations - What the teachers expect from you
 - Study Skills
 - Homework
 - Writing based assessments
- What to Expect with AP- What you need to know to be prepared
 - Grading - be prepared for that B!
 - Time management
 - Testing is more writing based/ explanation vs. multiple choice
- How to earn college credit



WHAT'S new?

Schedule Changes for Next Year

- Courses will be locked in
- No changes after school starts
- Change requests must be done through an online form



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Course requests do not guarantee placement into the courses. Final grades, test scores, class size, and scheduling conflicts may impact what you are actually placed into next year. We do our best to give every student their preferred courses. Having a back up plan is a good idea!



DUAL ENROLLment

- Review dual enrollment website for details
 - Must have a 3.0 GPA
 - Must have passed both testing requirements for graduation
 - Must show readiness on PERT or other entrance exams
- Applications available on Santa Fe College Dual Enrollment website- Open NOW
- Complete our registration form anyway in case you don't get accepted or change your mind

General Advisement Tips



- Consider your time when choosing courses
 - Honors and AP courses will require additional time outside of school to read and be prepared for class
 - Choose a balanced schedule so you can manage extra-curricular responsibilities with school work
- Challenge yourself, but also be realistic
- If you've never taken an AP course, start with ONE!
- SCHEDULE CHANGES WILL NOT HAPPEN LIKE THEY HAVE IN THE PAST!!!



NCAA Requirements

- If you are an athlete and considering playing sports in college, you need to make sure you take the right classes in high school to be eligible
- Check the [NCAA Eligibility website](#) for more details
- Tell your school counselor so they can also help guide you in the right classes to take



BRIGHT FUTURES SCHOLARSHIPS

- Bright Futures is a scholarship program for Florida residents who want to attend college in Florida
- You can receive up to full tuition for 4 years plus free books if you qualify
- You must plan ahead to make sure you are taking the right classes

ACT/SAT/CLT TESTING

- Many colleges require testing for admissions
- Bright Futures requires specific scores for eligibility
- Can be used to meet Reading/ Math Testing Graduation Requirement
- More test dates outside of school

ACT School Day for all 11th graders- March 26

English, Math, Reading, and Science sections

- What's a good score?
 - An average score is a 19-22
 - The highest score is a 36

university Admissions Requirements



- Universities have various admissions requirements
- You must apply and they will select you based on your transcript, test scores, and extra-curricular activities
- Must take 2 years of the same world language
- Must take Algebra 2 and higher math
- Success in AP classes are highly recommended
- Check the school's website for requirements
- Talk to your school counselor if you are planning to go to college



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- Track Bright Futures progress
- Create a portfolio- track your activities and awards
- Explore careers
- Explore colleges
- Take self-assessments to learn more about yourself

Access through MyPortal- all students have accounts already set up! 



HOW TO FILL OUT YOUR REGISTRATION FORM



- You do not need to choose something from every category
- Choose at least one course in English, Math, Social Studies, and Science- if you want to add a backup choice, number them with 1 being your first choice in that category
- For all other classes, number them with 1 and 2 being your main choices for electives and then 3-6 being your backup electives



WHAT'S next?

- Talk to teachers- learn more about courses BEFORE you sign up for them- also learn about pre-requisites so you're not surprised!
- Check your graduation requirements in Skyward to see what you need
- Prepare questions for your individual advisement meeting
 - Will meet in English classes throughout April
