

Ways to Read with Your Child

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Choral Read

- ◇ With this type of reading you are reading the book aloud together with your child. (You should set the pace with your reading.)
- ◇ Make sure to ask questions before, during, and after reading some of the answers should be right in the text, while others should make your child use connections and background knowledge. (see Reading Question Handout)
- ◇ If your child mispronounces a word you should: stop reading, point out the word and say it correctly, have them repeat the word, then together reread the whole sentence.
- ◇ Track the words while you are reading with your finger, a pencil, or other object.



Read Aloud

- ◇ With this type of reading you are reading the book aloud to your child.
- ◇ Make sure to ask questions before, during, and after reading some of the answers should be right in the text, while others should make your child use connections and background knowledge.
- ◇ To make it more interesting: talk about the illustrations as you read, use different voices for the characters.



Follow Me

- ◇ With this type of reading you begin by reading aloud. Stop in the middle of a sentence, have your child read the next word or finish the sentence. (Do this through the whole book)
- ◇ Make sure to ask questions before, during, and after reading some of the answers should be right in the text, while others should make your child use connections and background knowledge.
- ◇ Track the words while you are reading with

Echo Read

- ◇ With this type of reading you read a sentence or a page. Then have your child echo the sentence or page back to you.
- ◇ Make sure to ask questions before, during, and after reading some of the answers should be right in the text, while others should make your child use connections and background knowledge.
- ◇ Track the words while you are reading with your finger, a pencil, or other object.
