GENERAL

- Wednesday, November 11th is Veterans Day and school will be closed.
- All community service must be pre-approved using the form titled, "Community Service Registration" (Form 2575.01 F1). This registration requires approval from the student's parent (or legal guardian), the supervisor participating at the agency for which the services are performed, and a guidance counselor, before the community service begins.

Definition of COMMUNITY SERVICE for Bright Futures - 2575.01

"Community service", for the purpose of this policy, is defined as altruistic tasks performed with the intent of enhancing the quality of life in the school or the community at large. No other reward can be gained by the student from the service performed other than the credit for the time spent performing the community service. The agency, organization, or person who is being benefited by the community service may not profit financially from the volunteer work performed by the student.

- A. **Examples of acceptable** community service for purposes of this policy include but are not limited to:
 - 1. volunteering at non-profit or government agencies;
 - 2. participating in a project that benefits the community or school;
 - 3. religious mission work;
 - tutoring another student in a supervised after-school or community-based program; or
 - 5. working as a member of a service club to perform a club project
- B. Non-Examples that are not considered community service for purposes of this policy include but are not limited to:
 - 1. personal preparation for an event (rehearsal, practice, packing suitcases, plane ride, sleeping or eating at the site where community service is rendered);
 - 2. performing community service during school hours on days school is in session;
 - working at game concessions to earn money for a club or activity with the proceeds credited to individual student indebtedness (fair share);
 - 4. working at a business that produces revenue from the work performed by the student(s); or
 - 5. community service hours provided as a result of court action.
 - *Financial Aid* is an important part of paying for college. Buchholz High School will be hosting a Zoom Meeting on Tuesday, November 17th at 7:00pm for parents and students to learn more about financial aid and the application process. Mr. Pedro Hernandez from the Office of Student Financial Assistance will be covering the following topic during his 30- minute presentation.
 - What is Financial Aid?
 - What is the FAFSA?
 - Where do I find Financial Aid?
 - How do I apply for Financial Aid?
 - When do I apply for Financial Aid?
 - Who can help me?

Following the presentation, there will be a question and answer period. Students and parents will be reeving an email with the zoom link.
