 - Not possess a degree from a 2- or 4-year College when applying for the scholarship
 - Do not have to be an athlete merit-based scholarship
- The Santa Fe College Foundation offers a variety of scholarships to students graduating from Alachua County schools who plan to attend Santa Fe College fall 2021. The eligibility requirements vary depending on the degree program and the scholarship. An essay is required. The priority deadline to apply is February 15, 2021. The <u>Anne Ford Scholarship</u> is a \$10,000 scholarship (\$2,500/year over four years) for a student who will be enrolled in a full-time bachelor's degree program in the fall.
