The Mathematical Association of America has a series of tests that determine which K-12 kids get to be called Olympiads. This is the highest honor a K-12 student can get in math without actually being on our 5-person International Olympiad team. Florida had 11 qualifiers out of a total of 328 in the country. Alachua County had 4 of those. Buchholz had 3 and no other school in Florida had more than 1. Our qualifiers were:

We also had 2 Junior Olympiad qualifiers out of a total of 7 in Florida. There were a total of 300 qualifiers in the US. These kids got to take a 6 question 9-hour test last week. 3 questions in 4 and 1/2 hours each of 2 days.
