Children’s BMI vary based on age, gender, height and weight. BMI does not tell the difference between muscle and fat. If your child is very athletic or is very tall, his or her BMI can be high, even though the child is not overweight. *It is recommended that you discuss your child’s BMI with his/her doctor if they are in the underweight or in the increased future health risk ranges.*
