ex	rida law provides for the transfer of rights when an individual reaches the age of majority at age 18. An eption to this transfer can occur in response to a petition, a court determines that the individual is apacitated and a guardian is appointed.
ser rea wi	s is especially important for students with disabilities who receive exceptional student education (ESE) vices under the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA). At least one year before the student ches the age of majority, the student and parent must be informed of the rights under IDEA that I transfer, including the legal rights and responsibilities regarding educational decisions. Information and truction on self-determination must address the ways in which the parent may continue to participate in the dent's educational decisions, including:
1.	Informed consent to grant permission to access confidential records protected under the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) as provided in s. 1002.22, F.S.
2.	Powers of attorney as provided in chapter 709, F.S.
3.	Guardian advocacy as provided in s. 393.12, F.S.
4.	Guardianship as provided in chapter 744, F.S.
	ents' and students' rights under IDEA are often called procedural safeguards and are described in the tice of Procedural Safeguards for Parents of Students with Disabilities that is attached.
	u will turn 18 within the next year. At that time, your parent(s)'/guardian(s)' rights under IDEA will asfer to you. Some examples of the rights that will transfer include:
•	The right to give or revoke consent for an evaluation or reevaluation.
•	The right to give or revoke consent for services.
•	The right to give or revoke consent to invite certain agency representatives to IEP team meetings.
•	The right to participate in mediation, file a state complaint, or request a due process hearing.
•	The right to receive written notice before any changes can be made to your educational program.
