

February 1, 1902- <u>Langston Hughes</u>, poet and author, was born 1902-1967.

February 2, 1897- <u>Alfred L Cralle</u> receives patent for his invention, the ice cream scoop.

February 3, 1870- 15th Amendment (Black suffrage) ratified.

February 4, 1913- civil rights activist <u>Rosa Parks</u> was born, 1913-2005.

February 5, 1934- baseball player Hank Aaron was born, 1934-2021.

February 6, 1820- The <u>Mayflower of Liberia</u> sets sail from New York with 88 men, the first organized immigration back to Africa.

February 7, 1926- The first <u>Black History Week was begun by Carter G. Woodson</u>.

February 8, 1986- Debi Thomas (1967-) became the first African American Woman to win the US National Championship for figure skating.

February 9, 1952- <u>Ralph Ellison</u>'s book <u>Invisible Man</u>, wins the National Book Award.

February 10, 1992- <u>Alex Haley</u> the author of Roots dies, 1921-1992.

February 11, 1990- Nelson Mandela is <u>released from prison</u> in South Africa.

February 12, 1793- The <u>Fugitive Slave Act of 1793</u> became the first law of its kind under the constitution.

February 13, 1923- The first Black professional basketball team "<u>The Renaissance</u>" was organized.

February 14, 1946- Actor, <u>dancer, singer, choreographer</u>, <u>Gregory Hines</u> was born, 1946-2003.

February, 15, 1968-<u>Henry Lewis</u> became the first African American to lead a <u>major</u> <u>symphony orchestra</u>, The New Jersey Symphony Orchestra.

February 16, 1957- Actor, director, producer Levar Burton was born, 1957-.

February 17, 1963- Basketball great Michael Jordan was born. 1963-.

February 18, 1867 - The Agusta Institute, which will later become Morehouse College was founded.

February 18, 1931, Novelist, Chloe Anthon "Toni" Morrison was born, 1931-2019.

February 19, 1992- John Singleton becomes the first African American director to be nominated for an Academy Award for the film Boyz in the Hood.

February 20, 1895- Frederick Douglass died, 1818-1895.

February 21, 1961- Otis Boykin receives the patent for the electrical resistor

February 22, 1989- DJ Jazzy Jeff and the Fresh Prince win the first Grammy for <u>rap</u> <u>performance</u> for "<u>Parents Just Don't Understand</u>".

February 23, 1868 <u>W.E.B. Du Bois</u> was born 1868-1963.

February 24, 1864- <u>Rebecca Lee Crumpler</u> became the first African American to earn an M.D. degree.

February 25, 1948- Martin Luther King Jr. ordained a Baptist minister.

February 26, 2020- <u>Ramona Hood</u> becomes the first African American woman CEO of Fedex.
