Directions: The Every Student Succeeds act requires that the principal of each school with a Title I program attests annually in writing as to whether the school is in compliance with the requirements of Section 1119 of the law. These requirements are as follows:

1. Each teacher hired and teaching in a program supported with Title I, Part A funds (all teachers in a School-wide program) must have a Florida Teaching Certificate in the subject areas they are assigned to teach.

 - a. 60 college credit hours
 - b. A passing score on the assessment for paraprofessionals.

 - a. Each instructional paraprofessional must work under the direct supervision and in close and frequent physical proximity to a state-certified public school teacher.
 - b. No paraprofessional may provide services during a time when a student would otherwise be receiving direct instruction from a teacher.
 - c. Paraprofessionals may be assigned only limited duties consistent with those assigned to similar personnel.

Dear Parents/Guardians;

Alachua County Public Schools complies with federal and state law concerning the requirements of teacher certification requirements (ESSA sec. 1112(e), Florida Statute 1012.42). 


