- Santa Fe College Counselor-in-Training (CIT): Interested students must apply by May 17, 2021 applications can be found at [www.sfcollege.edu/cied/communityed/](http://www.sfcollege.edu/cied/communityed/). The CIT program is designed to help motivated rising 10th through 12th grade high school students receive leadership training and earn volunteer hours while assisting with **College for Kids**, a summer program for middle school students. This unique experience gives participants an understanding of commitment and the need for positive relationships with peers and adults as it correlates to teamwork. Students will have the ability to earn 65 volunteer hours. Students **must commit to all three weeks of camp**, which are July 12-July 16, July 19-July 23 and July 26-30. Camp will meet daily, Mondays through Fridays from 8:30 am – 12:30 pm **Interviews will be scheduled via email for May 24 - May 26 from 4 p.m. to 6 p.m. via ZOOM**. If selected for the CIT Leadership Program, the applicant must participate in a **mandatory training program on June 23rd from 1:00 pm – 2:00 pm via ZOOM**. The training consists of team building, conflict resolution, other leadership skills, safety, and College for Kids policies. The cost is \$100.00 for the 3-week session, which will include 2 camp shirts.
